

Mango Bingo!

Grade Level: 1st Grade

Objective: Children will be able to describe characteristics of a mango, how it grows, and other various information about the fruit. They will become more familiar with this tropical fruit, hopefully increasing their interest in fruits in general.



Illinois Learning Standard:

What You Will Need:

Bingo Game Card (1x30)

Bingo Place Marker Pieces- laminated pictures of mangos (~25x30)

Activity Instruction:

1. Pass out MANGO "BINGO" cards and place markers while explaining the rules of the game
2. Pick random mango facts from a bag and have children mark matching words on their cards
3. When a child has a "MANGO" (an entire row, column, or diagonal line covered with markers) check their spaces to see if they win a prize (fruit stickers, pencils, or something small)

Fun Mango Facts:

- Mangos are the most popular fruit in the world
- A mango tree can grow as tall as 100 feet
- In India a basket of mangos is considered a gesture of friendship
- Mangos were first grown in India over 5,000 years ago
- In some Latin American countries, mango on a stick with the skin peeled back is sold by street vendors
- Most of the mangos sold in the U.S. come from Mexico, Peru, Ecuador, Brazil, Guatemala, and Haiti (mango.org)
